

**A** painter's painter, Frank Eber works in a direct loose style influenced by the Old World masters. Typical in his art are color mixes and light that evoke nostalgia while remaining absolutely in the present.

Frank's watercolor workshops reach beyond technique, encouraging individual expression, and observing the elusive balance of forces that create beauty in painting.

Frank will share advanced painting techniques to create atmosphere, balance, and unity in your work. Topics will include design and composition, color and lighting, positives and negatives, simplification of shape, and atmospheric effects. # Exploring Pastels

## *Faythe Mills*

**T**his class is for all levels, and if you have never tried the pastel medium before, it's a perfect way to get started!

Bring to the workshop a photo of what you would like to sketch either on your phone/laptop or a hard copy. Faythe uses her phone or laptop to draw from, making it easy to zoom in on the image when needed, but you can use a hard copy photo if you wish. If you would like to project your image on to the pastel paper to do a quick sketch for accurate proportions, email the contact person in advance your photo so it can be converted to a png image for the projector.

If you don't have supplies you can purchase a set of supplies for \$15, which includes: a pencil for sketching, a set of 64 soft pastels, 3 finger cots, an 11"x14" sanded pastel paper stapled to a foam board; an 11"x14" cut mat board to protect and make your drawing ready for framing, and a clear sleeve to put your drawing in until you frame it.

# Sami Bracelets

- Reindeer Hide, Horn and Pewter Thread

*Kim Bakken-Parr*

The Sami People are the indigenous people of Sweden, Norway, Finland, and the Kola Peninsula of Russia, and have a long history and tradition of reindeer breeding. Wanting to use all parts of the reindeer, they make beautiful jewelry out of reindeer leather.

In this class we will start by braiding pewter thread (nickel-free alloy with 4% silver) and sewing it to a reindeer leather strip. The ends of the bracelet are stitched closed using sinew thread and a button clasp made from shed reindeer antler tips is attached.

All tools are provided, but if you need magnification for this close hand work, please bring your own. Additional kits will be available to purchase from the instructor.

# Garden Sculpture, *Brad Wegscheid*

Create durable outdoor garden art using sculptural cement and “Marana Stone”. Textures, patterns and shapes are easy to create at any skill level. Marana Stone is the lightweight core that is easy to sculpt using basic hand tools. Layers of fibered sculptural cement are then added for a finished detailed surface. Marana Stone is made from 85% recycled Styrofoam and cement. Keep the Styrofoam out of the landfill and make art!

The free May 21st demonstration at the Art of The Lakes Gallery will be an introduction to Marana Stone, the process of working with it, and the endless possibilities for creating!

The workshop on June 15th will be a hands-on creation of your own sculptural work using Marana Stone and sculptural cement. Projects can range from a small stepping stone to a bird bath. Material costs will vary based on final artwork size. We will start using basic hand saws, knives and trowels to rough out a core shape in Marana Stone. Then layers of highly fibered sculptural cement will be mixed to the consistency of clay and added to the sculpture. The final step is coloring and sealing the works. Depending on weather and project size coloring and sealing may be done later as a group or based on individual needs.

### **Let's make some trees and mountains from Aunt Ida's Drapes!**

**J**oin Pam Collins for this fun and creative class and create your own masterpiece by learning to use fabric and notions in a unique way.

Learn how to cut or tear fabric and glue it onto a canvas to create a landscape or seascape. Pam will walk you through the whole process. You will discover how to use gauze to make clouds, corduroy to form rocks, and delicate lace to make sea foam. Taffeta can be transformed into water or skies. It is a simple process of using scissors and glue, but the challenge is making a textile transform into a three-dimensional looking piece of art. Good imaginations are needed, and/or a willingness to explore. Anyone can learn this. No experience is needed. You will never see fabric the same way again.

You will work on an 11 x 14 canvas and all materials will be supplied. You will leave with a finished piece of art! You only need to bring a scissors for cutting fabric.

The finished basket will be approximately 4 ½" wide and 2" tall; this picture is representative of the basket, but each person's will be unique. The pine needles provided for the basket were gathered in Florida from the Long Leaf pine and processed by the instructor. All materials/tools will be provided with choice of wood or ceramic center, thread color/type, and beads.

## *Marcella Rose*


